

“Danger Until Death” – Five Years On from the Taliban Takeover

This week marks five years since the Taliban regained control of Afghanistan. For the country’s tiny Christian community, life has become unimaginably dangerous. Many believers have fled; others live in deep secrecy. Yet, against all odds, the church remains alive. As Jesus reminds us, “*With God all things are possible.*” (Matthew 19:26)

Life for Christians Today

Under Taliban rule, every choice carries risk. Even selecting a Christian name can lead to death. There are no public churches; fellowship happens quietly and informally. If someone’s faith becomes known, their property may be seized, their family threatened, and their life placed in immediate danger. Girls are especially vulnerable, often kidnapped or forced into marriage.

One Christian family recently endured a violent night-time raid. The father was stabbed, his son’s fingers broken, and his wife’s hands pierced. Despite this, the father wanted to stay in his community to forgive his attackers and share the hope of Jesus. His wounds later became infected due to lack of medical care, but he eventually received treatment. The danger, however, remains constant.

Yet God continues to work. Many Afghans are weary of the Taliban’s harsh rule, and whole families are coming to Christ. Their faith resembles the book of Acts—courage, miracles, and costly discipleship. One woman, divorced and cast out after becoming a Christian, still praises God for the peace she has found.

Supporting Afghan Believers

Open Doors partners in Central Asia provide discipleship, practical help and long-term support for Afghan Christians who have fled. These relationships help believers grow in resilience and faith, even as they carry deep pain.

Please pray:

- For believers suffering in silence, with no one to pray for them.
- For those paying a heavy price, that their faith would be strengthened.
- For unity across the global church.
- For protection, courage and wisdom for Afghan Christians and those who support them.
- For Afghanistan itself—that hearts would soften and many would encounter Jesus.

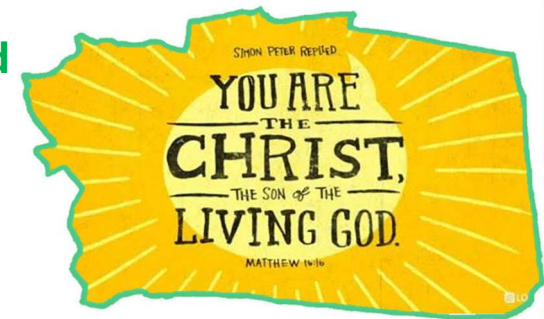
A Prayer
